Neither Home Depot nor the holding company could convince us who had authority over the property.

We also intended it as an emergency shelter for homeless and climate disaster. The property could be taken by eminent domain for emergency purposes. If you want to take any legal action, both entities can be parties in interest.

NOW COMES Plaintiff Brattleboro Common Sense ("BCS") by and through its attorney and states as follows:

1. Kurt Daims owns real property, known as 16 Washington Street, State of Vermont (the "Property"). The Property is a single- family, ??
2. Daims donates the use of the property to Co-plaintiff Brattleboro Common Sense, Inc. ("BCS"), a Vermont charity through a lease for nominal rent of \$50 per year. BCS has its meetings, administers its projects and generates income from rental units on the property. The first two floors

of the main structure comprise a large apartment with shared spaces and private bedrooms. Daims works for BCS and resides in the Property.

3. One of the projects of BCS is to develop liberal rental policies to benefit chronically homeless and “housing-insecure” people.

4. Defendant Trinity Blais (“Defendant”) resides in the Property

5. Venue is proper pursuant to 12 V.S.A. § 402(a), because the real property at issue lies within Windham County,

6. Plaintiff and Defendant agreed to a congregant rental arrangement for \$600 starting August 1, 2023, with no deposit. By this agreement Plaintiff supplies a private bedroom and shared kitchen, bathrooms to Defendant.

11. to make its monthly contribution payment of Six Hunched Ninetccn Dollars (\$619.00).

1.2. However, Defendant has not fulfilled her i ental pay ITjent obligation.

13. For the periotl of April tlii’origli Deccc-rnber 2023, Defendant paid \$1,126 in April, nothing fi oin May tlii otigli September, \$2,000 in Oc toher, \$1,300 in November, and \$1,300 in December, leaving a balance of \$4,408.00 unpaid for this pei’iod. The total obligation was S10,1 34.00 for this nine-month period.

14. Defendant has paid no rent for 2024, adding an additional 52,252.00 (January and February, at S1, l 2f).00/month) to the unpaid balance.

15. For the entii c period of April 2023 through February 2024, Defendant has an outstanding balance of \$6.6é 0.00 ($\$4,408.00 * \$2,252.00$). This will increase by an additional S1, 1.26.00 on M arch 1, 2024, and e> ery first of the month her ea ftei .

16. On Decciiiber 22, 2023 Plaiiiti ffs sent Defendant a Notice of Tennination for Nonpayment of Rent (the “N otice”) by hand delivei y and first-class mail. A ti ue ai«J acc urate copy of the N ot ice is attached as Exhibit 4. The notice was hand delivei ed on Decenabei 22, 2tJ23, and Ms. C“hamberlain signed indicated her iccept. Iti. at 2.

1.9. The Notice notified Defendant of her then outstanding debt of Four Thousand Four Hundred and Eighty Dollars (\$4,408.00). It explained that pursuant to 9 V.S.A. § 4467(a), termination would not occur if Defendant tendered the back amount in full by February 9, 2024, and advised

that an ejectment proceeding would occur if Defendant did not tender said payment. Exhibit 4.

20. Defendant was provided proper notice of the specific date her tenancy would end— February 9, 2024—which is more than thirty (30) days after the date in the Notice of Termination, which is the same date the notice was hand delivered. 9 V.S.A. § 4467(a); V.R.C.P. 9.2(b).

21. The Lease provides that “[i]f the Tenant acts in violation of this lease, the Owner shall be entitled to collect reasonable attorney’s fees and other costs and expenses from the Tenant, if successful in its action to enforce the lease.” Exhibit 1, pg. 6, } 16.

22. As of the date of this Complaint, Defendant has not tendered the full amount and remains in possession of 14 Overlook Drive, necessitating this ejectment action.

WHEREFORE Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court grant the following relief:

A. A writ of possession to Plaintiff for 16 Washington Street, specifically

B. Order Defendant to pay all past-due and arrearages due in full, including attorney’s fees.

C. Such other relief as the Court deems reasonable and just.

HOW TO START RUMORS and WITCH HUNTS,

But first a summary

SUMMARY UPDATED SEPTEMBER 1, 2024

We started a low-cost semi-private community-based true emergency shelter in RVs in Brattleboro in 2022. It allows healing away from crowding and drugs. It is an easy (not pretty) solution to the poorest victims of the housing crisis. "Community-based" is a meaningless buzzword here. It means real semi-private small shelters not down-town.

We asked officials several times to start a permitting process to fit the new kind of shelter, and after one told us to go ahead without a permit, the planning board sued to evict us for zoning (parking) violations, and the local health board (selectboard) sued to evict us for violations of rental safety codes. In April, 2023 a Superior Court Injunction said the shelter was safe and could continue under easy conditions. In almost all trials the Town has relied on rumor and technicalities and excluded much of our evidence. The Town wanted fines of \$72,000, and the court decided on only \$9828, but the court approved the notion that individuals can be sued for actions of corporations that they work for ! We thought we had a plea-bargain to remove the RVs and drop all the charges, but the Town is still threatening to take our home and fine us \$4M.

On April 30, 2024 the local safety case was dismissed, and so the injunction expired, and July 12 The Supreme Court decided against us re an order from the State Board of Health, citing inadequate formatting of our brief. Lacking time, and unable to produce proper briefs, we withdrew our appeal of the zoning case. So, the town still theoretically has the authority to sell our home. On May 4, 2024 the Town said it would not "release any enforcement", but to date has not filed any enforcement action .

We continue to advocate the true-emergency community-based shelters in RVs as the only realistic shelter model . Our RVs have been donated as shelter for homeless people around Brattleboro, and we have started a small shelter in our home. and we do not release the Town of its duty to address the issues.

RUMORS and WITCH HUNTS

There was one hostile neighbor who said something like I'm going to make life hell for you. He sent an inquiry to the town zoning officer.

The town zoning officer offered to show the neighbor's inquiry to the board that was the jury of our first trial, and the man wrote an improved (false) complaint for that. (BTW this secret evidence was never disclosed before or at trial.) The zoning officer also sent official notices to our neighbors. The hostile neighbor then contacted three of them, and the health officer had them write their inquiries on "complaint" forms. At trial the health officer implied there were many complaints, saying that he "began receiving complaints January 24" and didn't mention that those were the last complaints. He mentioned public nuisance statutes several times to imply that there had been a nuisance. In a later report he listed dozens of "associated

In email to us one neighbor admitted [REDACTED] that she saw nothing and that she complained on the basis of what she had been told. [REDACTED] The only thing visible to the public was the back end of an RV in our driveway. The only public nuisance was the reaction of town government. Almost all the information -- and it was false information -- came from one hostile neighbor. At trial he said that his daughter told him. She was eighteen months old.

All four witnesses against the shelter were connected to the hostile neighbor or the zoning boss.

SHORT FACTUAL LETTER

Our website shows evidence in public documents and video -- not rumors and implications. We have a new project: short factual letter-writing. What we need you to do, please, is visit the FACTS page brmse.org and write or post about one thing that you saw there. That means, don't base your writing on your opinion, or on ours, but just on the documents and video. on that page.

The goal here is NOT to write an excellent letter, but to start a new thing: short factual letter-writing and build the writer's confidence. Many people want to write, but are not confident of their writing abilities or their opinions. For this project just state the facts: "I saw this what the Town did etc, etc, on video" .

EXAMPLE

"I went to the evidence page at brmse.org that Brattleboro Common Sense (BCS) has. It's about the lawsuits against their RV homeless shelter. This town official Elizabeth McLoughlin says on video that there's no housing crisis. She says that the BCS director was the only person who says there is a housing crisis." Then add a brief comment.

If you want to add a second thing from the web page, that's fine, or get another person to co-sign the letter with you, that's fine, too.

E-mail your letter to the "Reformer" news@reformer.com. Give your name and home town -- and phone number only for verification, also send to "The Commons" - voices@commonsnews.org (They like a tiny intro about you and your civic interests). And post and share.

If you want help with a longer letter, just ask.

About the putative legislative counsel memo; maybe I misunderstood you. The age of a law or legal decision is not a defect. Consider any number of statutes, the Miranda decision, Plessy v Ferguson, Roe v Wade). I think your concept of confidentiality would pertain only to matters of the requesting legislator's individual rights. Anyway, will it hurt to ask ? Please ask any friendly legislator to request from the Office of Legislative Counsel a copy of their opinion or other writing that they may have produced regarding eminent domain in response to the attached letter or other request.

Even with the lawsuits here in town BCS continues to be effective. The police department has begun to implement our SAFE Limited Police Disarmament Plan. The selectboard's ordinance has been rescinded, and the Board is not popular for leadership. It is preferable to enlist cooperation, as anyone would try first. Just now the cooperation of local officials is not needed for advancing a homeless emergency legislation. There is some truth in the slogan, "If the people lead, the leaders will follow."

BCS has made regional and international news without local government support. This meeting is a strong way to build toward the emergency declaration that you wanted.

The Youth Vote amendment won a year or two AFTER a legislator asked BCS to slow down.

=====

We should have explained the basics of eminent domain. When a government invokes eminent domain, it is called a "taking". The government doesn't simply take the property. It forces a sale at a price which can be contested by the owner. In the case of the hotels that price should be their value according to the fair prices and lower occupancy rates that prevailed before COVID. Often eminent domain is only threatened, and the owner then complies with the government demands. Faced with the taking of the hotels, the owners should offer to reduce their prices to pre-COVID rates, and this would be a great relief to taxpayers.

Another matter for discussion is the conservative approach to the homeless problem. There have been a few people in Brattleboro who despise the homeless. These aren't liberals or conservatives; they're just mean-spirited and scared about taxes and everything else. That's not who we mean by "conservative". We mean for instance one truly conservative person who scolded us on social media, saying that we should give our house to the homeless. We already did that. Not understanding eminent domain, she was concerned about the tax burden, but her conservative approach should be considered from a philosophical angle.

This is the difference between liberals and conservatives. Liberals want government to pay for or implement certain policies. Conservatives say go slow, handle it without government money. These are the opposite liberal and conservative philosophies. Conservatives often oppose government paying for a policy, which makes liberals think that the conservatives oppose the policy. The homeless crisis in Brattleboro was an emergency three years ago, when our director, Bruce Clauson, advised the selectboard of the need for community-based "decentralized" shelter, asking town officials to make new permitting processes for the new kind of shelter in RVs. We called it so, not just because it sounds nice. We meant the community -- individual people -- need to help, for three reasons. First, the homeless should not be concentrated downtown. Second, over-crowded shelters are unhealthy for people suffering mental problems and drug addiction. Governmental mass-production shelters are necessary as a last resort, but they perpetuate the problems. Third, a property owner can host

a tiny shelter and make all the rules, and with a neighbor or two can show kindness to a single homeless person. This is the principle that we are forced to look at. The homeless need kindness and engagement, and they will gradually rejoin the community. A French physician, Philippe Pinel (1745-1826) proposed the concept of mental illness and thought kindness was the first way to heal it. Before him people thought was the first to advocate for the humane treatment of the mentally ill, emphasizing kindness. Government can't do that. Mass-production-style shelters cannot provide semi-private care.

Liberals might think that people who oppose government support of homeless shelters are conservatives. In many social media posts about the trial of BCS' for its emergency RV shelter people scolded the selectboard. They assumed that the ill-advised charges were driven by Republicans. The matter is not so simple.

The conservative philosophy, which is closer to common church group activities, is what's needed. We're not talking about Trumpism; we're talking about taking action compared with calling for government to take action. Consider the Dad's Place Church in Bryant, Ohio, who sheltered homeless people in their building. Consider the Centre Congregational Church on Main Street where Marshall feeds people and the pastor himself maintains a rental toilet for homeless. Such generous acts without tax money show more the conservative philosophy than the liberal one.

This is not what we want to believe. We took action after a year of lobbying the government, and we are still advocating for government action, like eminent domain.

Different Views of the Housing Crisis.

Patient Caldwell is not a patient. That's her first name. She goes by "Patience". She posted a plea for help on social media because she is desperate.

Patience stayed at the BCS emergency shelter in our headquarters and home on Washington Street for several days. She is with Andrews her dog, and Litton her cat. Both of them are very nice. A generous neighbor is storing Patience's car, with all her possessions. We are full right now, and soon her funding will run out and she is terrified of living in the cold.

Andrews is big and over-affectionate, but they are all drug-free and quiet. If you or anyone else has a space for them in your home, she will be eternally grateful. At BCS they had their own room, and you'd hardly know they were there. BCS can advise about preparing space. If you noticed the cautionary FPF note and hesitate to use her E-mail, BCS can relay messages and funds for her. BCS is a non-profit EIN 82-4276085. Patience is a professional housekeeper and she's looking for work.

The people at BCS housed and sheltered many others in desperate situations and with and alcohol problems. They have an idea what the housing crisis is about. People in government have a different sense of the housing crisis.

At the 2022 meeting of the Housing Coalition of Southeast Vermont in Brattleboro Vermont Speaker Krowinski and other members gushed about big housing construction projects to solve the housing crisis. They were silent when reminded of the labor shortage and the problem relocating great numbers of construction workers here without housing for them to live in. But big construction – financing innovations – tax rebates – grant-incentivization, or whatever, big construction is the box that officials think in. That box is their sense of the housing crisis. At a meeting of the Brattleboro delegation on Saturday (3/1/2025) people gushed again about a big housing project that took three years and included some tiny number of apartments. In fancy Jackson Hole, Wyoming there are "affordable housing" units for sale at 1.4 million dollars. Such plans are the same if they're available in 2027, and no one can afford them anyway.

Meanwhile over half a million RVs (motorhomes, trailers, campers) are sitting empty in peoples' driveways and dealers' lots all over the US. These can be a solution to the national housing crisis and the homeless crisis, as our emergency shelter has shown. Altogether our officials feel no urgency. All and any of their proposals would have seemed normal ten years ago. They are not emergency projects.

Several legislators and former legislators are promoting an emergency declaration to the governor. Our well-intentioned Brattleboro delegation and other Democrats have co-signed a letter for this, but will not start anything controversial. Cities can take emergency action without the legislature or the governor. We need officials to split from their well-intentioned colleagues and to start real emergency action, like the BCS emergency shelter or housing in RVs, or our in-home warming shelter, or emergency ordinances to house homeless people in public buildings, or

to take unused properties as shelters under eminent domain. A true sense of emergency is possible. In 2010 Brattleboro approved the BCS resolution for taking Vermont Yankee under eminent domain. Remember the sense of emergency around COVID ? We need officials to have a real sense of the emergency.

I'm really tired of bureaucrats making lip service about the housing crisis.
In yesterday's paper in the article that sounds like other articles about

was there I heard it at the trial of BCS and she went on about the director of
BCS being the only person who thought there was a housing emergency.
No one on the board contradicted her. No wonder you get nowhere with
the homeless problem with such people in your govenrment. She should
resign. Now you have this perfectly good idea that can house and shelter
homeless people for pennies, and you're pulling hour hair out like it's a
complicated problem. I was there. I stayed in that shelter. An electrician
checked it all out. There was no "immediate fire hazard", like the town
inspector said. He said the elctrician's work counted legally as dangerous
because the electrician was licensed in New Jersey. He said we paid rent.
We didn't. Before the town made a fuss there were no complaints except
by the activist neighbor who said that his baby daughter reported someone
pooping outside my RV. We didn't. There was all rumors and hearsay and
legalistic bunk that the board chose to believe. And it turns out later that
the inspector had no special education or training. That was your town's
lead witness. He's just a guy. That's how all this got started. The activist
believed his daughter, and faslely reported to your inspector. The inspector
reported falsely to the board, and the board didn't even allow BCS to

present its report in their own defense. Then the board reported again falsely to the next court, and in the Vermont Superior Court the judge wasn't fooled, and he issued an injunction that RVs were safe, but the town kept prosecuting. And when the next court ran out of time, the town attorney maneuvered to exclude BCS's evidence again, and on it went. So, instead of checking out a dirt cheap solution to people sleeping in the snow -- oh yeah -- your board believed this un-trained inspector who is not a doctor -- who said it was safer to sleep in the snow !! He said this -- so your board threatens BCS for \$10,000 per DAY. Probably they need it to pay your town attorney for two years to do a cover-up of them blocking peoples testimony and pretending to believe stupid rumors instead of having a dirt-cheap way to shelter away from yur downtown area. Hello everyone. Kurt Daims. I live in district two. I work with Brattleboro Common Sense . We have two projects to mention tonight. First is vthe emergency housing project. ZcFor those who don't know, BCS has four people living in RVs at our corporate HQ on Washington Street. The other is the SAFE Policing Project. This was offered as community policing, part of our SAFE Policing project. You may remember that BCS made this offer when Chief Carignan was in office. I think the idea may have fallen through the cracks with the changes of administration. We want to reaffirm our offer of housing for the Brattleboro Police department. Now the progress of our emergency housing project makes it possible and very cheap for a police micro station to be set up on Washington Street. We have an RV that is manufactured as an office. It has a built-in desk and reception area and would be just right for a police micro station. We ask the board to allow funding from the community safety fund, and we are looking for grant support as well. We hope the select board will consider writing an emergency ordinance to waive permits, since the zoning administrator Brian Bannon has already agreed to waive the permit fees. In this way the emergency housing project can dovetail with the safe policing project, and after we get the kinks smoothed out, the RV micro station could be moved around to different neighborhoods in town.
